
College-Prep or Honors/AP?

Step 1: Core Course Recommendations

- Your 8th grade teachers will recommend next year's core courses based on a variety of indicators including grades and standardized test scores. Recommendations will be shared with students by lanuary 17th.
- Recommendations will be viewable in Home Access Center starting Tuesday, January 17th at 7PM.
- Consult with your current middle school teachers with questions regarding recommendations.
- Core classes are English, Math, Science and Social Studies.

Step 2: Research

Step 3: Select

January 18th - January 26th

- Enter elective choices in Home Access Center, This is required by January 26th! Home Access Center will
 close at end of the day.
- Instructions: Log into Home Access Genter. First click "Classes" tab, then click "Requests" tab. Classes are found by clicking the "Edit" tab by department (Spend time exploring).
- When entering your courses in Home Access Center, the credit total should equal 7.0 credits when you finish.

College Prep or Honors? Placement Questions? January 18th through January 26th

Your teacher will make their best recommendation based on a variety of indicators. If you disagree with a placement, a parent or guardian must take the step below. This process is deadline specific.

Level Up request (example: college prep to honors)—a parent/guardian must contact the appropriate High School Department Chair by January 26th for review. Department Chairs for Core Courses are listed below and will notify the counselor of approved changes.

NEUQUA VALLEY REQUIRED FRESHMAN COURSE SELECTIONS
